Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 22, 2024

Scripture Reading: Micah 5:2-5a

Don't obey God to get things; obey God to get God. —Tim Keller

Today, we light the fourth candle of Advent, the candle of LOVE. How does one go about loving God? It's difficult. Maybe, we think, God has put some sensitive souls on earth who become mystics, pastors, theologians, monks, nuns — and they can do all the spiritual heavy lifting for the rest of us.

These dear people don't seem to have any difficulty at all living in an emotional aura of love for God. That's okay, we say, "but it's not my cup of bliss."

Clearly, to love God is not to do any one specific thing for God. God really doesn't need anything done for him, thank you very much. The words of Jesus indicate that loving God is a state of being that encompasses the whole of our existence. We love God with our souls and hearts, that is, the intuitive persons we are, and with our mind and strength, that is, the rational, volitional creatures we are. Still,

- Some say they love God by going to church every Sunday.
- Some say they love God by not breaking the Ten Commandments.
- Some say they love God by reading the Bible every day.
- Some say they love God by praying to God at least once a week.
- Some say they love God by doing a good deed.
- Some say they love God by not swearing.

I don't see it this way. For me, loving God is not work, but a walk.

The prophet Micah provides the paradigm here. What does God ask of us? God asks us to walk with God (Micah 6:8).

There it is.

Jesus says we should love (read: walk with) God with our intuitive and rational selves. What happens on a pleasant walk with a friend? Sharing (intuitive) and good conversation (rational). A walk is an intimate experience. To walk with someone is to express solidarity and understanding. It is a mark of friendship and camaraderie. It is a sign of intimacy.

To love God is to walk with God.




